Launching in the Netherlands in November, the WEpod will be the first self-driving electric shuttle on public roads. During the testing phase, the six-person vehicle will be traveling a fixed route between two cities and can be booked by passengers via an app.

Apple, Inc. is increasing efforts to bring a semi-autonomous electric car to market by 2019 by tripling the 600-person team currently working on the project.

Flywheel Taxi files lawsuit against California state regulators, claiming that the uneven regulation between taxi and TNC services, like Uber and Lyft, is a violation of equal protection under the Fourteenth Amendment.

BIKESHARING

Houston area officials announce that \$4.7 million will be invested in the expansion of the city's bikesharing program, BCycle. Plans include growing from 210 bikes across 29 stations to 800 bikes with 100 stations.
