SCOOTER SHARING

Uber invests in Lime and plans to rent Lime scooters through its app. Uber's logo will also be visible on the scooters. Lime scooters are dockless and electric, and the company is operating its scooter service in 70 markets across the U.S. and Europe. This investment follows Uber's acquisition of JUMP electric bikesharing in April 2018.

SHARED AUTOMATED VEHICLES

Daimler, Bosch, and Nvidia partner to launch a shared automated vehicle (AV) service in California next year. The service will run on select routes in Silicon Valley. Daimler Mobility Services will operate the fleet of automated shuttles using Nvidia's AV platform, and Bosch will supply components, including sensors and control units.



BIKESHARING

Ofo ceases operations in Chicago as a result of the city's updated locking requirements. In June 2018, Chicago stated that bikesharing operators can only add bikes to their fleets if the bikes can lock to stationary objects, such as bike racks. Ofo's bikes have wheel locks, which cannot be used to lock to objects.



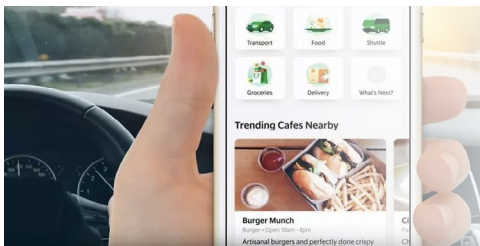
BIKESHARING

Dockless bikesharing launches in New York City. Roughly 150 bikes are available for use in Queens as part of the city's dockless bikesharing pilot program. Lime and Pace each plan to deploy 200 bikes in Queens by August 2018.



COURIER NETWORK SERVICES

Grab and HappyFresh, a grocery delivery provider in Southeast Asia, partner to launch a grocery delivery service. Grab's drivers will deliver HappyFresh groceries, and customers will be able to pay for the service through Grab's app. The service, GrabFresh, will launch in Jakarta, Indonesia.



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
