ADVANCED DRIVER ASSISTANCE SYSTEMS

A Tesla that appears to have no one driving crashes in Texas. The crash resulted in the vehicle lighting on fire, killing its two passengers. One passenger was found in the front seat and the other was in the backseat.



GOODS DELIVERY

Nuro, a robotics company, and Domino's Pizza partner to deliver pizzas in Houston, Texas. Customers placing a pre-paid order from Domino's Woodland Heights location within certain days and times can choose to have Nuro's R2 robot deliver the pizza. The deliveries are beginning in April 2021.



SCOOTER SHARING

The New York City Department of Transportation (NYC DOT) selects Bird, Lime, and VeoRide for the city's initial scooter sharing pilot. The companies are beginning operations in the Bronx with 1,000 devices per operator in Summer 2021. The NYC DOT expects most rides to cost less than \$5 per customer.



TNCs/RIDESOURCING

Lyft launches Lyft Pass for Healthcare. The program lets health care organizations send patients prepaid passes that can be used for rides to doctor's appointments. Health care organizations or social service agencies can create a budget, set approved pickup and dropoff locations, and share passes with their patients.



URBAN AIR MOBILITY

ANA Holdings, an air transportation company, and Wingcopter, an aerospace company, partner to develop a drone delivery network in Japan. The network is anticipated to deliver pharmaceuticals and other consumer goods. The partners are using Wingcopter's vertical takeoff and landing drone. Wingcopter is providing pilot training, mission planning, operational design, and maintenance.
